From The Venerable Derek Chedzey

As I write this we are fast approaching the fourth anniversary of the full scale Russian invasion of Ukraine on February 22nd. I have learnt through listening to the Ukrainian community who came here following that invasion that for many this war actually began in 2014 when Russia invaded the Crimea. Our communities have offered hospitality, love and care to those displaced by this act of war. Wherever we look our news is constantly full of conflict and around the world there are armed conflicts and tensions which cause us all to stop and ask is there not a better way to resolve our differences. Whatever the politics and reasons for the Russian invasion what is clear is that despite peace negotiations this war is continuing to see people killed and injured on both sides. It is important we do not lose sight of the fact that in war there are no winners only losers.

There are many theological arguments on whether warfare can ever be just and how we appropriately remember those lost in war. For us as Christians the Bible has a lot to teach us about the root causes of warfare and bloodshed. We are also reminded in those same pages that we are called to serve one another and to care for those who suffer. The ultimate sacrifice will always be to give our lives away for others.

“Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends.” John 15:13

As Christians we are called to build relationships that create peace and harmony and offer the reconciling power of Jesus’ love. We are to offer a better more appropriate way to live and it is through the empowering of the Holy Spirit that we are changed. It is the Holy Spirit that builds the fruit of the Kingdom within each of us, and this enables us to bear one another’s burdens and create communities of peace.

As Jesus prepared for his own death, he warns the disciples not to lose heart when they see strife in the world. As they stand outside the temple in Jerusalem, he warns them what is to happen in their lifetime. His words are fulfilled in 72AD when the Romans destroy the temple in Jerusalem, but they are also just as true today for us as for his disciples.



“Jesus answered: “Watch out that no one deceives you. For many will come in my name, claiming, ‘I am the Messiah,’ and will deceive many. You will hear of wars and rumors of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All these are the beginning of birth pains.”

Matthew 24: 4-8

Jesus does not mean that we have to accept war with its horror and bloodshed but that we should respond to it appropriately. The New Testament teaches us that human selfishness, greed and intolerance lead to conflict. The church has a message of hope and the solution to these driving passions deep within humanity. If we are in any doubt, it is Jesus and his sacrifice for us that reconciles us to God and helps us offer peace in the world. We are called to fight evil and stand up for the Kingdom and its values; in doing so we help to build a better world. Our job is not to judge but to offer love and support. As a clergy person I have had the privilege of hearing the stories and experiences of grief and pain that war brings from those most impacted by it. I have always tried to bring God’s love, forgiveness and compassion to those who are tormented by memories of war. As the church we are called to care for those who suffer and to build a more peaceful world. In this period of Lent perhaps we should all pray for peace and reconciliation wherever there is conflict

Clergy Thoughts

Clearing out the Clutter and finding Contentment

I have a secret: I'm messy. The trouble is, I actually don't like mess — but I'm not naturally tidy either. So, every now and then I choose a room, or a cupboard, and clear it out. I sort the clutter, organise what's left, and sometimes even add labels (for the benefit of everyone else in the house, of course).

A few weeks ago, it was the larder. I was amazed at what we've accumulated in just seven months! But once it was done — once everything had a place — something changed. The important things were visible. Cooking felt less stressful. I even felt more inclined to bake. A small act of clearing out created space for something good.


I wonder how your Lent is going? Perhaps you resolved to give something up and you've kept to it faithfully. Perhaps you made it to day two. Perhaps you decided to take something up — prayer, volunteering, generosity — and it hasn't quite taken root in the way you'd hoped. If you're anything like me, it's very easy to turn Lent into a measure of our own spiritual success or failure. And when we fall short, the temptation is to feel disappointed in ourselves.

But I don't think Lent was ever meant to be about proving ourselves. Yes, it is a season in which we draw closer to Christ in his suffering. St Paul, in his letter to the Philippians, speaks of wanting to know Christ — even in his sufferings. But that journey is not about self-loathing, it's about deeper trust, dependence and ultimately deeper contentment in Christ. Over the past few years, I've begun to think of Lent less as “giving things up” and more as spiritual decluttering. Just as clearing the larder makes space and helps me see what I actually need, Lent can be a time to notice what clutters our hearts. What distracts us? What weighs on us? What patterns, habits or anxieties make it harder to see God's presence clearly?

It isn't about relentless self-criticism. It's about making space. Yes, I will slip up. We all will. That's why Jesus teaches us to pray, “forgive us our trespasses.” But we do so held in the promise of Romans 8 — that there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. So perhaps, for the rest of this Lent, the invitation is not to try harder, but to clear a little space. To set down what isn't needed. To focus on what matters. And in that newly cleared space, to discover that Christ has been there all along.





Benefice days in 2026



The Upper Room - Ann Clarke

Readings:

Mathew Chapter 26 Verse 17

Mark Chapter 14 verse 12

Luke chapter 22 verse 12

John Chapter 13 verses 1-17

The four gospel writers all tell the same story: it was just an ordinary room, but Jesus makes it special. We also have a room in our hearts. Is it fit to house Jesus? The house (temple of God) resides within you.

On Ash Wednesday and throughout lent, culminating on Palm Sunday we have an opportunity for a spring clean. Many Christians take up self-denial as a discipline, giving up chocolate, coffee, alcohol, snacking, losing the remaining weight from Christmas.

In gardening terms, we have to make room for new plants, making space to let the light in, encouraging new shoots. We need to internally prune, weeding out old ideas, cutting back negative thinking, resentments and frustrations.

As the climate warms, we are ready for the flowering; for the fruits of the spirit (Galatians, chapter 5 verse 22), the sins of the flesh (Galatians chapter 5 verses 19-22).



An Upper Room did our Lord prepare for those he loved until the end. And his disciples still gather there to celebrate their risen friend.

A lasting gift Jesus gave his own: to share his bread, his loving cup. Whatever burdens may bow us down, he by his cross shall lift us up.

And after supper he washed their feet, for service too is sacrament. In Christ our joy shall be made complete: sent out to serve, as he was sent.

The Upper Room Continued - Ann Clarke

Thomas Telford's Church of St Mary's was built 220 years ago, having an upper room on the left of the gallery. On Sunday 1st February we celebrate Candlemas. We blow out candles and turn the lights off a bit earlier each day over this period. After the service over tea and coffee, a few of us got together to discuss the spring cleaning of the upper room, which had been a dumping ground for saleable items collected for the fund over the years.

Operation Upper Room. This room measuring four square metres overlooked the original choir vestry. It was then divided into two rooms to house a toilet and small storeroom—the latter used for Little Stars equipment. A new choir vestry was built by adding a room under the balcony on the right and a corresponding room on the left to make a kitchen. (Hazel is always looking for help in the kitchen if you have time to spare.)

On 23rd February a team of volunteers gathered to empty the room—many black bin bags were filled for recycling and regularly used items put back in. The walls will be repainted and beneficiary boards that caused the patches were moved to the back wall of the gallery. The upper half of the room will be refurbished professionally when we have the money and we will have a tidy storeroom.

Cleaning of the church building is so important for the many visitors we have, not to mention all the services, life events, orchestral and choir concerts that take place. We now have a paid cleaner to take on the heavier work.

Throughout our lives we need to do an outer and inner spring clean—an earthly one and a spiritual one. This takes energy and discipline. When people have lost their way and can't get back on track, they need prayer. When we worry and can't sleep we are told to count sheep—much better is to talk to the Shepherd. I refer to it as a Spiritual Sat Nav—God shows us the way back to our destination, with Jesus leading us. Have a safe journey.

I Dream:

I dream of a Church, where love and people are more important than stone and steeple. I dream of a Church with an open door, where no one is privileged except the poor. I dream of a Church where mil and honey will flow more freely than power and money. I dream of a Church where young and old will be inspired to change their world. I dream of a Church that will make my dreams come true.





WORLD DAY OF PRAYER SERVICE

'I will give your rest, come'

The World Day of Prayer Service is a lovely ecumenical event, each year hosted by one of the town's churches and rotating around Anglican, Baptist, Catholic, Methodist and People's Hall churches in turn. This year it's the turn of St John the Evangelist's RC Church in Northgate.

The "World Day of Prayer" is a worldwide movement, led by Christian women of many traditions, who call us together annually for a shared day of prayer on the first Friday in March. The aim is to have a continuous global wave of prayer, starting early in the morning on the international dateline in Samoa and as the earth rotates, continuing through Asia, Europe, Africa and the Americas finally completing its circle of the earth to end in American Samoa.

Each year, women of a different country lead the call to prayer and select a theme for the worship based on their experience and concerns. This year it's the turn of Nigeria in West Africa; a country rich in mineral resources, and with the largest economy in Africa, yet where many still struggle to meet their basic survival needs, and risks of violence and kidnapping continue. Their chosen theme is based on Matthew 11:28:

*"Come to me, all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens,
and I will give you rest."*

One of their suggested prayers well reflects this theme.

Heavenly Father

*We all have burdens to carry, some heavy, some light,
Some which threaten to overwhelm us.*

For those whose burdens bring fear, we pray for peace;

For those whose burden is to fight against poverty, we pray for provision;

For those whose burden is past or present abuse, we pray for freedom.

*May the power of the Holy Spirit lighten the weight of the burdens
we carry*

and empower us to help ease the weight of other's burdens.

In Jesus' name. Amen

Although the 'World Day of Prayer' movement was started by women and the day was previously known as the, 'Women's World Day of Prayer', the change of name better reflects the fact that everyone is very welcome to come along to the service.
