

From Ven. Dr. Fiona Gibson, Archdeacon of Ludlow

Despite the adverts in the shops suggesting that parents buy new school uniform in July, the new school year is just beginning. Education has been part of my life and vocation from when I left school myself. I spent eight years teaching in primary schools, then worked as a lay children's minister, with involvement in our local church school. Then I swapped sides of the teacher's desk as our children entered their school years, and I had the novel experience of receiving reports rather than writing them!

Ordination brought ongoing opportunities to support the spiritual growth of children and staff alike in the parishes where I served, and since becoming Archdeacon of Ludlow I have had the enormous privilege of chairing our Diocesan Board of Education which oversees the wonderful work of our 78 church schools and academies and supports the diocesan education team in all that they do.

Our church schools and academies are not just places of learning information and life skills, but of putting down roots and building foundations so that each child and young person in our care has a chance to explore the Christian faith and experience the life in all its fullness that Jesus Christ promises.

There are so many ways we can all support this life-giving and life-changing work. Some may be called to become Foundation Governors, supporting and upholding the Christian foundation of the school. This is a vital lay ministry role. Yes, it can be demanding, but it is also immensely rewarding. If you'd be willing to explore what that might mean for you in your context, do contact me or our Diocesan Director of Education, Gemma Martin.

Others may be willing and able to support collective worship in our schools, perhaps by joining an Open the Book team if there is one in your benefice, and helping a new generation to hear and understand the stories of our faith. You could talk that through with your parish priest, who could let you know the safeguarding and training requirements.

And all of us can pray for our church schools and academies, for children, young people, staff, parents, governors, and Multi-Academy Trust teams. 24/7 Prayer has a downloadable PDF guide to praying for schools, available here https://www.24-7prayer.com/resource/pray-for-students-and-teachers/

However you may be able to support the life of our church schools and academies, I pray that it may be a blessing and encouragement to you as you bless and encourage others. Happy New (School) Year!

I loved it, obviously they were belting out my favourite tunes, Living on a Prayer, It's My Life and Wanted Dead or Alive to name but a few and it is an experience that grounded my love of music and maybe my huge crush on John Bon Jovi too but we won't tell my husband of 34 years and will keep that our secret.

However, this month I've had the privilege of serving on a team at New Wine which alongside (and wouldn't be possible without) over 1,700 amazingly gracious, committed people on the Bath and West Showground in Somerset. GUILD OF ST RAPHAEL & THE HEALING MINISTRY

The Guild of St Raphael was founded in 1915 & is an integral part of the life and work of the church. This prayer guild is dedicated to promoting and practising healing regularly in our church services. The prayer guild in St Mary's was led by verger Percy Harley. I joined the group in the early 1960s. The first healing service was led by Revd. Father Kemp and I went along to pray for my father-in-law, organist & choirmaster, who had cancer & wasn't going to recover. I asked that he would be free of pain and that night he died. I had recently lost my father and grieved for two fathers. It was time to realise God as my father. Up until then I hadn't had a relationship with God as my father figure. But He made it happen. This was my opportunity. I went through a spiritual awakening, dead to my life but alive to my life in Christ Jesus. After walking with God for fifty years there is no let up. People need to be transformed and they can't do this on their own. So for me Christ's Healing Ministry is a way to touch people, a bit like the sparkplug in a vehicle. The ignition needs a shock to spark it into life—the sacraments in the church are a way to do this. In Baptism we are asked to turn to Christ; at confirmation we are called by name and God makes us his own. For many years in churches throughout the world many healing services, perhaps once a month, quarterly, mid-week or evenings were arranged. However the report and book A Time To Heal have highlighted us to look afresh at the Churches Healing Ministry.

The sacrament of healing is an opportunity to show People of their need of God. Pentecost 2000 introduced Laying On Of Hands at the weekly eucharist service and invited lay people to respond to the call of using their gifts of healing. There are only a few of us left of the twelve original members that came forward twenty years ago. We look forward to re-introducing the sacrament of Laying On Of Hands & introducing it once a month during communion. It will be interesting to see how many people respond.

August and Trinity - generally a quiet time for churches, with no major festivals or events in prospect, mainly because it's the major holiday period and lots of people aren't there for at least some of the month. Oldbury is no exception, but things are still happening at St. Nicholas.

Firstly, we will have celebrated the wedding of Tom and Amber at the end of August. We've got to know them quite well over the year since they started attending and decided to have their wedding here, and we wish them every happiness in their new life together afterwards.

Secondly, we've been trying to plan ahead, at least to Harvest, and various ideas have come forward – none fixed by the time I have to send these notes in, so I can't confirm whether it will be just a simple service on an October Sunday morning, or whether we will be reviving our Harvest Lunch in some form, possibly with the Village Hall – but by the next issue it should be clear!

Before I go on to the serious practical matter of the church building, I must mention our VJ Day Commemoration on 15th August – ringing the bell and sharing stories of family members' experiences of the final end to World War 2, overshadowed by the way it was brought about. A Historic Step Forward

On 15th July 2025, after more than three years of tireless campaigning, it was officially announced that grief education will now be included in the national curriculum for schools in England.

This landmark decision marks the first time that learning about death, dying and bereavement will be recognised as an essential part of a child's education. By the end of primary school, children will learn that change and loss – including bereavement – can provoke a range of feelings, that grief is a natural response to loss, and that everyone grieves differently. By the end of secondary school, this understanding will be deepened,



exploring how families and relationships change over time,



including through birth, death, separation and new relationships.

The campaign was spearheaded by John Adams, of Perry & Phillips Funeral Directors (pictured above), author, and past President of the National Association of Funeral Directors (NAFD). Inspired by the loss of his Mum, Maria, when John was 12 years old; the experiences

supporting grieving families, and motivated by the belief that no child should face bereavement without understanding and support, John launched a parliamentary petition in 2022 whilst National President of the NAFD. The petition to add content on death, dying and bereavement into the national curriculum gained 11,322 signatures, and was debated in Parliament in December 2024, which John and a small cohort attended, this has now resulted in this historic change to statutory guidance for schools.

A Historic Step Forward Continued

John said:

"This is not just a change in policy – it's a change in the way our society approaches one of life's most difficult but universal experiences. Death touches every family. By teaching children from a young age about grief, we can create a generation that is more compassionate, understanding, and equipped to support one another in times of loss. This has been a long journey, but it's only the beginning of what I hope will be a lasting cultural shift."



For churches, this development offers new opportunities to connect with and support local schools. Grief education aligns closely with the Christian call to "mourn with those who mourn" (Romans 12:15), helping young people understand the value of care, compassion, and hope. It also encourages

communities to break the silence that often surrounds death, creating spaces for open and honest conversations.

John's campaign has already inspired conversations beyond the UK, with interest from Australia and New Zealand, where John will be speaking at later this year. The hope is that this initiative will one day become a global movement, ensuring that wherever a child grows up, they will have the knowledge, language and confidence to face grief with support around them.
